## **INSME Ongoing EU projects:**

- <u>XPRESS</u> Horizon2020: The project aims at facilitating the introduction of Renewable Energy Sources (RES) via Green Public Procurement (GPP); INSME contributes to the success of XPRESS initiatives by organising events and workshops aimed at identifying solutions, best practices and opportunities to enhance the uptake of renewable energy sources and facilitate the interaction between public procurers, innovative SMEs and final users.
- <u>THE NEXT SOCIETY</u> EU Neighbours: The project aims at mobilising entrepreneurs, innovators, and corporate ecosystems to tackle the challenge of economic development in the Mediterranean Area. INSME organises a series of Policy webinars called "Policy Labs" to highlight national instruments or policies considered as innovation best practices.
- <u>REESTART</u> ENI CBC MED Programme: The project aims at encouraging the private sector, investing in alternative sources of energy in Lebanon. INSME offers a training program to Lebanese SMEs, providing them with the necessary knowledge to build their capacity for accessing green financing sources at international level and pursuing their sustainable energy transition objectives.

Here some of INSME's previous EU projects:

- <u>BE.ST.</u> BEst practices exchange to STimulate Serbian SMEs growth Project aimed at contributing to Serbian economic growth, enabling SMEs and start-ups to deal with scaling-up, internationalisation and differentiation. INSME delivered workshops, an Innovation Toolbox and talored mentring sessions with high-level experts to entrepreneurs, enabling them to access tools, methodologies and techniques to enhance the competences acquired during the workshops.
- <u>SISPRINT</u> High Growth Firms Research: governance and ecosystem characteristics allowing the enhancement of HGFs; funded by Unioncamere (the Italian Union of the Chambers of Commerce, and INSME member), Italian Territorial Cohesion Agency (ACT) and the EU.
- <u>EBSOMED</u>: offers business support and peer learning to organisations and businesses in the Mediterranean.

- <u>MIRRIS</u>: Mobilising Institutional Reforms in Research and Innovation Systems. INSME activities: facilitation of policy dialogues in the EU12 countries and Croatia (with a special focus on Cyprus and Malta).
- JEUPTISTE: Japan-EU Partnership in Innovation, Science and Technology. INSME activities: organization of innovation workshops among industry and academia in Japan and Europe; collaboration on the strategic workshops on EU-Japan Collaboration and harmonization of research policies; support to the policy dialogues, bilateral dissemination of twinning/networking opportunities.
- <u>EUROMED INVEST</u>: OPEN Neighbourhood Programme. INSME activities: organization of master classes for young women and diaspora entrepreneurs covering the following topics: stimulating innovation, open and closed innovation, management of innovation, internationalization, access to finance, pitching to investors.
