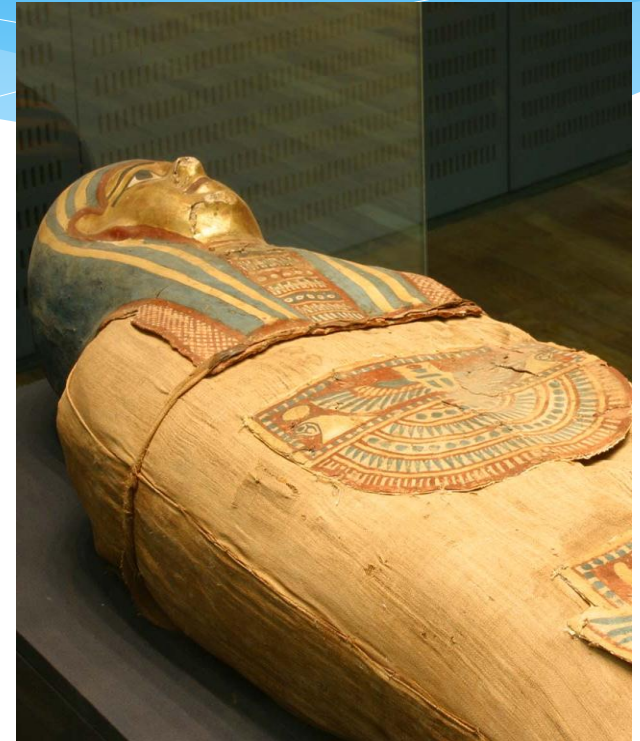


Alexandria Port & Port Museum

The visitor can see the ancient marble streets of Alexandria as well as the city houses in the Roman era & their mosaic floors.

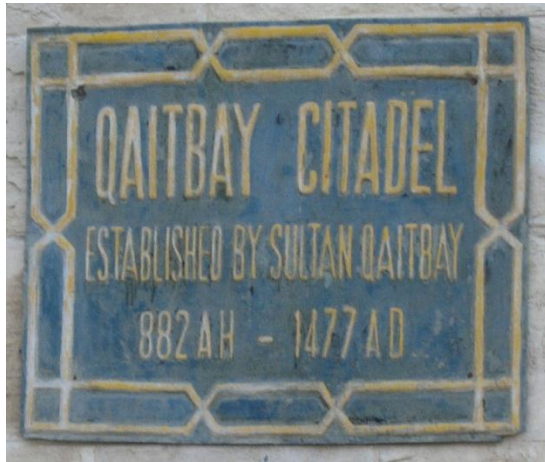


Citadel of Qaitbay
